WHAT IS PRAASA?

PRAASA is the Pacific Region AA Service Assembly. It was held on March 5th & 6th in Irvine, California. The event was attended by over 1400 dedicated service representatives, delegates, past delegates, curious newbies and just plain trusted servants.

Although part of the name is service assembly, the main focus, as with most assemblies, is just one goal...the yearly General Service Conference held in New York. PRAASA is the vehicle held each year to educate, disseminate and pass on information about the agenda topics previously sent out to the groups via the GSRs. At the assembly, presenters are selected to speak on each and every agenda item. Included are sharing sessions and workshops for the various service positions. At night there is a lively banquet followed by a speaker meeting with two speakers. All are invited to the speaker meeting.

That's the technical side of the PRAASA story. A little dry perhaps but oh so necessary. Very much like the countless hours put in by the trusted servants of AA.

So what's it like going to a Service Assembly for the first time?
