June 24, 2023, I attended the Area PICPC Committee meeting where we had a presentation of information from American Psychological Association conference. Several professionals had questions about the God word in AA literature. Our committee had a discussion that brought up the way we present at non-AA meetings and how to best present the Spiritual part of our program to professionals. It was suggested that we use the medical definition of Spirituality that is based on principles not religion. This was agreed as the best way to share information on spirituality, as it is based on empathy, connection, and compassion.

The Area PICPC committee is supporting a hybrid workshop that is planned in September. I will keep all informed as this will give anyone who is interested in presenting at non-AA meetings an opportunity for training.

Our district meeting continues to be the last Sunday of the month at 6PM. We are available to support anyone who has questions about reaching out to professionals, cooperating with public agencies, and providing literature for Health Fairs in our community.
