## BANK ACCOUNTS & TAX ID NUMBERS

## Common Questions and Answers

**Question:** Our group needs to open a bank account and we were asked for an "I.D. number". What is that?

**Answer:** The I.D. number asked for is an EIN, or Employer Identification Number. It is required for an organization to do things like open a bank account number. You may obtain one quickly and easily for "banking purposes only".

Per AA Guidelines for Finance, individual groups are **NOT** allowed to use GSO's EIN or their 501c3 (non-profit tax status). That EIN and status are **SPECIFIC to AA GSO**. For spiritual as well as legal reasons, no local A.A. organization may use the tax-exempt status or identification number of the General Service Board of Alcoholics Anonymous, Inc., since <u>each entity is autonomous in financial matters</u>.

**Question:** How do I obtain an EIN for my group?

**Question:** Getting an EIN requires someone to be the responsible party, what happens when we get a new treasurer?

**Answer:** When your group gets a new treasurer, you will need to file a Form 8822-B. It's a simple form:

**Question:** Does this mean we will need to pay taxes?

**Answer:** AA is in no way attempting to give tax advice for single A.A. groups or other entities. This information relates to the United States only, and does not apply to Canada. Always consult a professional.

- The A.A. Guidelines on Finance Doc provides high level tax information relating to required annual filings.
- Some large A.A. Groups or Intergroups/Central Offices apply for tax exempt 501(c)(3) status when their gross annual receipts exceed \$5,000. Consult a local tax professional if you plan to go this route.
- If your A.A. Group takes in less than \$5,000 annually (i.e., less than \$100 a week) it is not required to apply for 501(c)(3) status and it is exempt from taxes.

## Instructions for obtaining an EIN:

How to Obtain an Employer Tax ID (EIN) Number You could do this by contacting the IRS to request Form SS-4: "Application for Employer Identification Number."

Beginning January 6, 2014, the IRS now refers all domestic EIN requests received by phone to the EIN Online Assistant. **THE BEST WAY** is to do this online:

- Access the online EIN Application.

- 2. Scroll below Steps 1, 2, and 3 and click on "APPLY ONLINE NOW".
- 3. On the next screen, click on the "Begin Application" button.
- 4. On the next screen, scroll down the list and click on "View Additional Types, Including Tax-Exempt and Governmental Organizations". Click Continue.
- 5. On the next screen, click on "Community or Volunteer Group". Click Continue.
- 6. On the next screen, click Continue.
- 7. This takes you to the "Responsible Party" screen. This requires entry of a group member's name and SSN. This can be any member of the group (does not have to be the treasurer, etc.). After entry of SSN, you have a choice of clicking "I am a member of the group...", or "I am a third party applying ....". I recommend you choose "I am a member...". Click Continue.
- 8. On the next screen, enter the address info for the individual. Click continue.
- 9. On the next screen, enter the name of the group, county, State and month/year group started. The month/year info is not critical info.

- 10.On the next screen, "Tell us More about the Community or Voluneer Group", click No for each question.
- 11.On the next screen, "What does your Business or Organization Do?", click OTHER at the bottom.
- 12.On the next screen, click Other at the bottom and enter "Self Help"
- 13.On the next screen, "How would You Like to Receive your Confirmation Letter?, click "Receive Letter Online" and Continue
- 14. The next screen will show you a summary of your entries. If everything is OK, click Submit at the bottom.
- 15.In a few minutes, you will have access to a PDF document that provides your official IRS EIN number for the group. Print out a copy of this info to take to the bank to open the new checking account.
